School Tours

WANYA... Nyanda tours are a unique opportunity to learn about Aboriginal People in a beautifully preserved natural area, so close to a major Australian city. Nyanda is the Yagara word for waterhole or lagoon.

- Nyanda school tours are designed to meet the requirements of Australian school based curriculum. During the school tours, Australian students learn about the history of the Nudgee Waterholes, the Aboriginal People, how the natural environment was used, the social events that united the tribes, and hands on participation in learning about the tools, objects and items created for everyday use.
- Learn about the bush foods available in the natural environment and how they were used.
- Aboriginal people sharing their knowledge and experience, to make the tour a valuable learning opportunity for students.
- Schools can also organise to have stone tool making, basket weaving, black bean or boomerang painting workshops for classes, held in the Nudgee Waterholes facility on the grounds of the Banyo Football Club.
- Throughout the tours the local language is incorporated into the information and student guide books.



Prices

- Prep - Primary school 1 ½ hours maximum of 40 students per session, at \$15 per person. Includes the school tour experience.
- Secondary school 1 ½ hours maximum of 40 students per session, At a price of \$25 per person. Which includes the school tour experience, A spear throwing or fire making demonstration.

Additional activities - To enhance the students experience, \$5 Per Person.
